### Notes from the October 28th Board Meeting

These are meant to be a brief synopsis of the meeting, not official minutes. Those will be approved by the board at the next meeting and then posted on website.

President Ann Larson discussed developing a board member code on conduct. In addition, she proposed a Town Hall meeting for the following week (11/4), where members could join in person and have a question/answer listening session. The board passed.

A conversation about whether or not to allow late comers to be added to the ballot occurred, but the board decided to keep the current guidelines which include a due date.

Regarding the 2151 lot easement purchase, 163 ballots were returned, with 99 voting yes to purchase the easement and 64 voting no.

A variety of community comments range from our fine system (compliance) being unfriendly, complaints about neighborhood bullying, and a suggestion to have compliance information delivered by a board member.

The 2025 budget was approved by the board. Noted that there was a large increase in the budget for lake treatment (due to passing of last contractor and new bids being more expensive). Also, an additional expense for another porta potty. Assessments will NOT increase this year!

The compliance committee gave a brief history of the history of the compliance committee.

Park Mangers (Mike and Randy) submitted a report stating that the entry light has been repaired, broken signs replaced, the broken rfid lock at Main Rec replaced, and lots of cleaning up of debris. They request that if you plan to volunteer to complete some jobs on your own, please coordinate with them so they can arrange for proper waste removal and not be surprised by piles at parks. kenlakeparks@gmail.com

Thank you to the volunteers who built, labeled, and installed new boat racks at the West Side park this summer for about \$500. This saved the HOA at least \$4500.


Thank you to our events committee for the summer pot lucks, the dog days and trail events, and all of thew wonderful seasonal events happening soon. You make Ken Lake a special place!


