Notes from the July 29 LCC Board Meeting (official minutes are posted on website after board approval)

June minutes were approved. Meeting was held online due to potential rain. Community members commented on purchasing lot or easement at 2151 Lakemoor.

There is new sand at both beaches and mulch at the Tot Lot (thank you to many volunteers). Also volunteers made and installed new boat racks at both beaches. Folks on the waiting list will be contacted by Caleb. Existing boats are required to be cleaned. In addition, please lock boats or they will be locked for you. If this applies to you contact Caleb at kenlakeparks@gmail.com. Please let Caleb know if you see any issues with the sprinklers. Caleb is working to get quotes on power washing of courts. The discrepancies in water usage, the potholes on the Cedarbury walkway, and new sign installation are on the to-do list. The city will be repaving the Main Rec entrance – more info to follow. A reminder to please close gates behind you. If you suffer from swimmer's itch, stay out of the muck and shower and aggressively towel dry after swimming.

The committee for the 2151 Lakemoor Plot updated that the discovery process is complete, with a 24-page summary of documents included. A survey went out to adjacent property owners and will be due back Aug. 22nd. The board decided to solicit feedback from the entire community via VIS.

No geese have been spotted this month, the Urban Forest has no report this month, everything is looking good financially, and all garden plots have been rented.

A tree cutting notification at 1974 Cambridge was received, and a shed at 1703 Camelot was approved.

The events committee announced that the Ken Lake Olympic Games have been cancelled due to low interest. The time of the Shady Day concert on the 17th has been moved to 4:00 pm. The July 4th events were a success, thanks to Wendy Harris for all of her hard work organizing the event. Special thanks to many community volunteers, as this event is a success because of you! Boat races were held again this year and were lots of fun. Thank you to Dixie Havlak. Two concerts have been held – thank you to Cori Pembleton and Craig Thompson for organizing, and Dan Renfroe for set-up. Thank you to all who participate in the summer social- special thanks to Alicia Roberts-Frank and Rachael Montes. And thanks to all that participated in another successful Dog Days of Summer! 4th of July Race Results for 2024 submitted by Maria Nardella

Fifteen boys and girls from ages 5 to 11 participated in this year's El Tour de Lakemoor cycling race and a short running race. Eddie Frankowski, age 8 was the overall fastest cyclist this year. Hanna Murphy, age 10 was the fastest girl on a bike. Banks Andrus, age 8 and Hayes Andrus, age 6 led on their bikes in their age groups. Amber Lee, age 10 was the fastest runner. Everyone received a prize bag that included a wonderful assortment of bike gloves, locks, water bottles, energy bars, and more all donated from these local sponsors: REI, Trek Olympia West Bike Shop, and Intercity Transit. Stormwater Report provided by Al Hatten. James Packman of Herrera Environmental is collecting data and conducted an on-site visit on July 10th. Al supplied all our past analytical data from 2017 to current, including documents dating as far back as 1989. Several lake front property owners addressed their concerns on the muck and detritus material in or around their property.

Lake Quality report provided by Al Hatten- Our lake is doing very well! The aquatic herbicide was two times this summer to address aquatic and shoreline vegetation.

The current temperature of the lake is 80 degrees, and the lake level is about 10.5" BELOW maximum capacity and normal for this time of year. The 02 is steady at 93% - The clarity in over 5 feet - The fish population of bluegill and Bass are great! What's left of the painted trout are struggling due to the higher temps and can mostly be found in the West canal. The water sample results from the community beaches: None Detected (ND) for nitrates, phosphate, solids, and heavy metals. The Escherichia coliform came back at 27.7 E 100/ml. Recreational water should not contain more than 200 E. per 100/ml of water. As stated in the last report, concerns continue on the issues of "swimmer's Itch". The primary carriers of the parasite are the freshwater snails. The best remedy is to disrupt their habitat. This would essentially require the accumulation of detritus material usually near stormwater drainage point to be removed. This will probably require more review and board discussions.

All new business was postponed until next month.
