Notes from the December 16th LCC Board of Directors Special Meeting (official minutes are posted on website after board approval)

This meeting was called to address a specific agenda, mailed out to all residents. November minutes were approved. Several community comments were made, including the success of the Holiday Hayride, concerns about the recently emailed resolutions and proposed executive committee, updates about the lot at 2151 Lakemoor, concerns about houseless persons in the neighborhood, and more.

The winners of the election were announced, and the board voted on its cabinet. Evan Clifthore is President, Fred Yancey is Vice President, Tory Tjersland is Treasurer, and Quinn Haithcock is Secretary. Members at Large are Mike Gowrylow, Wendy Harris, and Ann Larson.

Maggie Marchand resigned as the Event Committee Chair, and Dan Andersen as the ACC Chair.

There was discussion on the proposed Code of Conduct, and it was noted that 3 current board members have signed it. The others agreed to look at it and discuss it in the future.

The meeting was packed with conversation, and also a lot of community input and discussion. The resolution proposed by Evan Clifthorne regarding the Executive Committee was discussed, and did not pass at this time.

The board implemented a technology committee that will look at all LCC aspects of technology. The board also agreed to reorganize all LCC Committees and is planning a town hall in February to discuss.

The board agreed to review the compliance committee and procedures with Ann, Fred and Wendy leading the work.

There were no committee reports and dates for future meetings are to be determined. For more details, please wait for the official minutes to be approved at the next meeting.

Update on the Access Trail to Kaiser Woods Park:

In a surprising change of events, the *access trail* to Kaiser Woods Park will remain as it is and *will not* move to the proposed easement location. The Board was unable to resolve the legal specifics of the easement agreement with the Havlaks by the October 31 deadline, and on December 1 the easement offer was withdrawn. On December 6, the property was sold to a new, generous family in Ken Lake who have agreed to maintain the lot for the benefit of the community. Margaret Fahy and Brian Nell are the new owners of the lot, and will be taking on the role of private owners of this wonderful community asset.

During community comment at the December board meeting, the Havlaks expressed their gratitude to this family for agreeing to maintain the property at their own expense, and to the many Ken Lake residents who spoke up during the 20 month long effort to make this a community property. Also at the December board meeting, Louise Becker announced that they were withdrawing all threats of legal action against the neighborhood concerning the proposed relocation of the trail.
