Notes from the LCC Board Meeting July 24th, 2025

(these are just highlights, official minutes to be posted when approved and shared by board)

The board meeting was held outdoors at Main Rec (a perfect evening!). Community comments included noticing a decrease in bats on the lake, and concern for low hanging cedar branches blocking access to the canal.

There was no security report, but President Mike Gowrylow talked about the NO MOTORS allowed on the lake rule. Several complaints about a hydrofoil last week prompted this discussion, and a reminder that no motors of any kind- including battery operated, trolling or remote control are allowed.

The Common Areas report was shared for Mike Frank by Randy Lubert. The main project now is trying to deal with the sinking West Side dock. It is still under warranty, but the company is refusing to address it. Mike is working with other companies, and the board will soon be deciding how to proceed, involving our attorney. Several trees need trimming, and this along with the low hanging trees in the canal was discussed. It was decided to save costs by trimming and removing them all at the same time.

Leslie Turner, Treasurer, reported that our finances are good, still "in the black," and that she and the finance committee are working on a 2026 draft budget for community review in the next couple of months.

The ACC approved tree removals at 2121 Lakemoor and 2049 Lakemoor, and a patio installation at 2167 Lakemoor.

The Lake Committee report was submitted by Al Hatten, and discussed the updates on the Lake Committee. They are still seeking volunteers for various subgroups of the committee. The lake is currently healthy, no e coli found in the water, and the clarity is good to 4 feet. The water is 8 inches below normal for this time of year, and currently around 78 degrees. The entire report will be on the website on the lake information page (under neighborhood links). Also, the Ken Lake Beaver still lives here and if he is bothering your trees, Marian Bailey suggested using paint mixed with sand to paint the base of the tree trunks as that deters a beaver from chomping at your tree.

Also, the lake will be treated soon for weeds and lily pads, just waiting on the permit from the Department of Ecology (has been approved since meeting date).

The Events Committee just appointed a new interim chair, Alicia Roberts Frank (thank you Andrea for your service). **However, the spot is open for a permanent volunteer!** Alicia has added some Dog Days of Summer events, a couple of Friday Night Socials at the Main Rec., and is looking for a volunteer to resurrect the Summer Movie Nights. There is a concert planned for August as well. Many thanks were given to the twenty plus volunteers who did so much to make the July 4th event successful this year! Set up & clean up, grilling, wrapping, sound system,

food prep, helping with the bike race and parade – all of you made the day rewarding for the hundreds of attendees.

The Garden Committee had a successful Garden Swap last week. Neighbors met, and shared plants from their yard and a good time was had by all!

The Technology Committee submitted a report as well. They are seeking about \$1200 to do a prototype for a new website, equipment for hybrid meetings, and more. The board is going to review the survey sent out last month, make some changes, and possibly resend it to residents again as not everyone saw it embedded in the newsletter.

Marian Bailey reported on the Urban Forest Committee, and a successful work party with adults and children that helped trim back the trail and clean it up. Marian replaced the cut down trees with 38 new ones, but they are dying due to the dry summer we are having.

Some board members attended a city meeting regarding zoning changes, which may allow businesses in residential areas. The proposed zoning changes also would permit multifamily housing in single family neighborhoods. The city sends many messages each week to HOA's. Ready for a four-plex unit next door?

Your Ken Lake Board of Directors has been closely following a major zoning change proposal for the City of Olympia that would allow multifamily housing to be built on single-family lots.

Lakemoor's covenants specify that only one home can be built on a lot, but city planners say if this higher density zoning is approved by the City Council, it will issue permits for builders to construct multi-family properties on our lots.

While our covenants prohibit such construction, the city has told us that it would not check our covenants or those of other communities before issuing multifamily construction permits. City

planners say they cannot track all the various covenants throughout the city, so it will be up to communities to defend their covenants after the city issues a permit. On top of that, the city doesn't plan on alerting communities to new construction permits it issues.

That situation means communities will need to be vigilant about construction activity within their areas and be prepared to file a lawsuit to stop construction that violates their covenants.

This situation is frustrating to say the least, and places an unreasonable burden on HOAs to spend the time and money to defend their covenants.

We don't know yet when the city will conduct hearings on this upzoning, but we encourage our residents to contact the city to protest this plan. You can contact **cna.olympia@gmail.com** to oppose this proposal. Unless, of course, you want apartments to gradually change the nature of our community.

Water Lillies!!??? How to deal with them from our lake

treatment expert/aquatic biologist.

"The community members should leave the lilies in place. The treatment is performed using a foliar method, meaning that the product must be left on the pads for an hour or two to get absorbed and translocated to the rhizomes. By cutting them, it likely caused the plant to send more pads up to make up for the ones that it lost."

In addition, please note that there was a delay in permitting with the Department of Ecology, and the lake will be treated very soon.
