Notes from the LCC Board Meeting September 25th, 2025

(these are just highlights, official minutes to be posted when approved and shared by board)

President Mike opened up the meeting by addressing rumors about board members allegedly being threatened with legal action by another board member. August minutes were approved. Community comments about being neighborly and maintaining control of your dogs were submitted.

Mike Frank, Common Areas Manger, is currently working with Watersmith to determine repair needs on the West Side dock. He is also in discussions with the city about some of our dangerous trees. Mike is working on getting playground bark, and busy taking care of all the parks. A reminder to all residents storing boats at a park to please lock them. Also, lakeside residents please secure items on beach before the rain starts. Last year, items floated off beaches and into the canal, including a kids water table! Keep an eye out for fall park and cul-de-sac work parties scheduled soon.

The Events report was given by Alicia Roberts-Frank. The movie night was well-attended, and Carol Gruen's cookies were a big hit. Thank you volunteers! The Fall Festival is scheduled for October 11th, and volunteers are needed. See announcement. In addition, the committee is adding two more Dog Days this fall... Sunday October 19th and Saturday November 8th.

Carol Gruen reported for the newly formed Safety and Security Committee. They have put up speed limit reminder signs in the neighborhood. The City of Olympia is also going to lend their radar speed sign to our community in the near future. A reminder to all residents to ask owners before you approach their dog. Not all dogs are friendly.

Marian Bailey spoke about the Urban Forest. She has secured new small trees to plant, and will do so once the UF isn't so dry. Marian is concerned about our trees in the UF and the entire community as well. Our extended summers are not conducive to our tree environment.

Shelia McCarten reported for the Goose Committee. A reminder that we will be hearing screamers from pistols over the lake, as several pairs of Geese are trying to make our lake home. Shelia is also asking for new members of the committee to help deter geese, and also wants to talk to new lakeside homeowners about ensuring that geese don't make their yards home. Fred Yancey reported that he went to a training and that the new state laws for HOA covenants is not going to be a cheap fix.

Elle Burger reported that the Tech Committee worked on a neighborhood survery and sought board approval. Please complete the survey.

Leslie Turner, Treasurer, reported that she was able to trim the 2026 budget, removing money from the wristband fund and changing the service intervals of the port-a-potties, and trimming some from the arborist line, etc. The 2026 budget was approved by the board, and will now represent only a \$10 increase per quarter, rather than the \$20 initially expected.

Board members Evan Clifthorne and Quinn Haithcock created an alternative budget that was acknowledged by the board, but the Finance Committee budget supported by the Treasurer was eventually passed.

The timeline for the 2026 board election was discussed heavily. It was decided that to meet VIS's deadlines for mailing, etc that nominations of 150 words or less will be due to the clerk no later than 11pm on October 7th. They may be emailed or dropped off at the house. VIS will produce ballots, and winners will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

In addition, the board is now going to review committee reports during the planning meeting on the third Wednesday of the month rather than the fourth Thursday board meeting.

Presidents Corner....

You should have received an email by now announcing that Lakemoor Board elections are coming up next month. If you missed it, information is enclosed in this newsletter.

This year's election is especially important given changes in state law affecting HOAs, and the need for communities to revise their covenants and bylaws to comply with new regulations, some of which take effect in January, and others not until 2028.

I won't get into the details here, but if we have to revise our protective covenants to comply with these new laws, it means for the first time since 2008, all the provisions of our covenants could be changed.

The most important provision, and one that may come under challenge, is the prohibition against multiple dwellings on a lot. As with many HOAs, only one home can be built on a lot, and that's the way it's been since the community was created in the 1960s.

Despite these protective covenants, the City of Olympia has adopted new building codes that allow multiple homes on a single lot, and is contemplating allowing even higher densities. That would violate our covenants, but the city says its up to the community to defend the single-family requirement, and the city won't deny multiple family building applications, even for Ken Lake.

A majority of the current board has made it clear that it will oppose any multiple dwelling attempts, including homeowners who want to build another home on their lots, which in planning parlance is called an Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU).

However, at least one member of the current board has stated publicly that we should allow ADUs, and believes that single-family HOAs should encourage higher density development in their communities. That could lead to duplexes, triplexes and even more units on a single lot, and hence larger populations despite having only a single exit from the community in case of emergencies.

The point here is that when we open up our covenants for revision, do we want a majority of the board to propose higher density development, or do we want to retain our single-family character? Who wins in the upcoming elections will in large part decide which way we go, so your vote counts more than ever.

It's election time!

Dear homeowners,

Another election is ahead of us, and we want to provide you with a timetable.

Four positions are up for election for two-year terms on the seven-member board.

If you as a homeowner wish to run for election, please draft a candidate statement of no more than 150 words, and email it to kenlakesecretary@gmail.com by Oct. 7. This deadline is predicated on the need for VIS, our management company, to include the names and statements of all candidates in a packet of budget and other materials to be mailed to homeowners in advance of our annual meeting Nov. 18. If you don't use email, you may drop off your statement at the home of our corporate secretary, Michele Rothman, at 2159 Lakemoor Drive SW.

Homeowners should receive their budget and voting packets by the third week of October and will have up until Nov. 7 to return their ballots to VIS, although they also can present or change their votes at the Nov. 18 annual meeting.

Please note: This year's Annual Meeting will be conducted via Zoom, as several Board members are unable to attend in person. Homeowners will still have the opportunity to submit or update their votes up until the election portion of the meeting begins. After that point, VIS will tabulate the ballots and announce the four candidates receiving the most votes.

In lieu of the in-person annual meeting, a social gathering of homeowners will be announced at a later date.
