Notes from the LCC Board Meeting

(official minutes are posted on website after board approval)

January minutes were approved. Several community comments were submitted this month, including the inability to see walkers at night time, safety at the front of the neighborhood (car accidents), and a need for kindness among community and board members.

Ralph Oliver said security has been good, just dealing with some speeders. The Clerk reminded folks of rfid band requests, the calendar on the website, and new id bracelets coming this spring.

The Community Gardens has a bed available. See page 1. They also are wanting a shed for the garden, possibilities include getting a new one or using a donated one.

The Urban Forest Committee wants to thank residents for helping to clear trees and debris from the trails after the storm. Also, a reminder to not feed the wildlife in the UF, especially the rice and beans that someone left behind - twice.

There were three approvals from the Architectural Control Committee. A fence and shed at 2206 Lakemoor, fence at 2139 Lakemoor Dr SW, and a shed at 1604 Camelot Pk.

The Events Committee reported on the Egg Hunt happening on March 30th for 12 and under, and several events planned for the spring and summer. July 4th events, concerts, Ken Lake Olympics, a Back to School swim party, and Winter Home Decorating Contest are in the works!

The Goose Committee has had no issues, and had to use screamers from pistols to scare them away on 6 days this month. A dead goose washed up on a private shore, and it was properly disposed of.

Leslie Turner, treasurer, reported that our finances look good. We have invested in CDAR's and the new id bands cost more than we expected.

The Lake Quality Committee (new name) has received two bids for lake treatment since the passing of our former vendor at PondWeeds. There is expected to be an increase in costs.

John Ulmer has been selected to fill the vacancy on the board.

Board President Dani Clark has planned the meetings for the 4th Monday of the month, with May, November and December being optional if needed (but not on the 4th Monday).

Discussion of a Ken Lake directory occurred, with possibility of using VIS's online management tool. A new RCW is expected to be passed that may make sharing of community emails difficult.

Thank you neighbors for being supportive and engaged in the community. As we work to get settled as a new board this year we are looking forward to continuing to learn with all of you. I am excited to be drafting a work plan for the board to follow this year so that we keep track of the critical tasks required of us as a board and have a direction to focus on as new topics arise. I want to thank Joel Rogers for the time and energy he put into the community as a member of the board. Joel has resigned from his role on the board for personal reasons and we have a plan in place to move quickly to fill that position with a special meeting. Our community is special because of each one of you that lives here, thank you for sharing your thoughts, attending events, joining committees, and generally being neighborly. You make Ken Lake a wonderful neighborhood.


